About the Program

Transportation to medical appointments can be difficult to find, especially if the appointment requires a friend or family member to pick you up after the procedure. With transportation becoming an increasingly prevalent issue for seniors, adults with disabilities, and veterans, RSVP of Carroll County has a program in place to provide volunteer drivers and escorts to medical appointments.

The RSVP Volunteer Medical Transportation Program has been bridging a transportation gap by providing thousands of medically related trips at NO COST to seniors and veterans throughout Carroll County since its inception in the 1980's.

This program enlists volunteers to take seniors and veterans to and from both local and long-distance medical appointments. Volunteers donate their time and use their own vehicles to transport ambulatory seniors, individuals with disabilities, and veterans who are unable to drive and do not have family members who can take them to their medically related appointments.

Your Help is Needed

As a volunteer driver with the Non-Emergency Medical Transportation Program, you will be on an on-call list along with other volunteers. When new requests for service come in, volunteers receive a notification and can pick and choose the appointments that fit in with their schedule. With this volunteer call-list system, we can provide seniors, individuals with disabilities, and veterans with access to a free, reliable, non-emergency medical transportation service.

How to Become a Volunteer Medical Transportation driver:

- Be at least 55 years of age
- Register/train as an RSVP volunteer
- Have a safe driving record
- Have a current and valid driver's license
- Have liability automobile insurance
- Have a safe/reliable road-worthy automobile
- Pass a Criminal & Motor Vehicle background check

Volunteer Benefits

- Personal attention of an RSVP Program Coordinator to ensure that your needs, skills, and desires matched to a volunteer opportunity that will be meaningful and enjoyable to you.
- Supplemental accident and liability insurance in excess of your coverage.
 - Quarterly newsletters full of information about program happenings and senior issues.
- Mileage reimbursement for the entirety of the transport.
- Invitation to the annual volunteer appreciation luncheon.
- Gaining new skills, insights into yourself, and making new social contacts while helping others in your community.
